The Similkameen Valley is the ancestral, traditional and unceded territory of the Syilx Nation, and is home to the Upper Similkameen Indian Band—the Similamix People—and the Lower Similkameen Indian Band—the Smelqmix People.



THE SIMILKAMEEN RIVER IS THE HEART OF THE VALLEY

Here, life moves at a different pace—slow down, take your time, and linger a little longer as you travel the 140 km (87 mi) stretch of BC's Crowsnest Highway 3, from Manning Park to Cawston. Along the way, take in rugged landscapes, winding roads, and the quiet charm of small-town hospitality.

Discover eclectic communities, working ranches, and family farms rooted in a rich past. Meet the locals in Princeton, Tulameen, Coalmont, Hedley, Keremeos, and Cawston, where stories of the land and a welcoming spirit are part of everyday life.

Carved over millions of years, the Similkameen River flows from the Cascade Mountains, shaping a diverse landscape of cliffs, meadows, forests, orchards, and vineyards. Long home to Indigenous peoples, this valley continues to reflect a deep connection to place—inviting both relaxation and exploration.

Provincial Parks



Manning Park Resort

Year-round adventure and events await at E.C. Manning Provincial Park, a vast 83,671-hectare wilderness in the Cascade Mountains—don't miss the Cascade Lookout viewpoint and unforgettable stargazing under dark skies. In summer, paddle Lightning Lake with kayak, canoe, and paddleboard rentals, or explore scenic hiking and biking trails through wildflower-filled meadows. In winter, hit the slopes for downhill skiing, explore groomed cross-country trails, snowshoe through backcountry terrain, go tubing, or try winter camping surrounded by snow-covered peaks. Stay at Manning Park Resort with options ranging from forest camping and RV sites to cabins, chalets, lodge rooms, and the Skyview RV Campground. There is even a place for your horses. Start or end your day at the Loon Lagoon indoor pool, sauna, and hot tub. Refuel with a meal and a pint at the Pinewoods Restaurant or Bears Den Pub.

Cathedral Park

Journey into Cathedral Park for a rugged backcountry experience with sweeping alpine views (check with BC Parks and Cathedral Lakes Lodge for current access). Hike through alpine meadows, past waterfalls, striking rock faces, and sparkling lakes. Watch for rainbow trout and wildlife such as mountain goats, mule deer, and bighorn sheep. In fall, the larch forest is especially striking. Stay in the lodge, an off-grid cabin, or camp beside a jewel-toned lake.



Bromley Rock

Bromley Rock is a perfect summer picnic and swimming spot along the Similkameen River, for wading and cooling off. Always use caution, as river conditions change with weather and seasons. For the adventurous, swim across the river for a closer look at the 50-foot rock formation or explore the forest beyond.

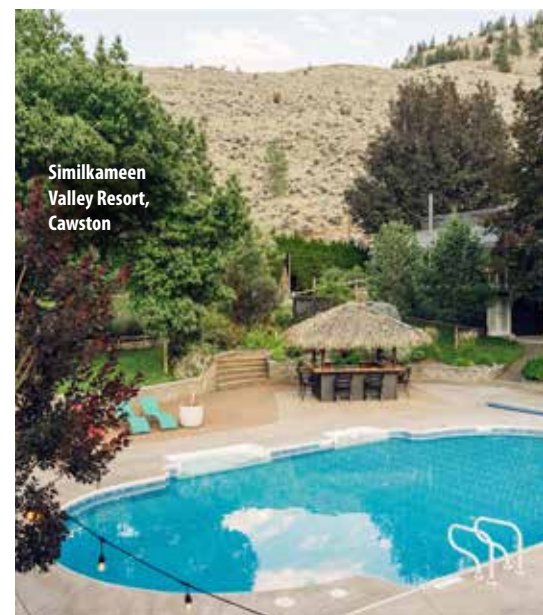
A Rich History That Continues to Evolve

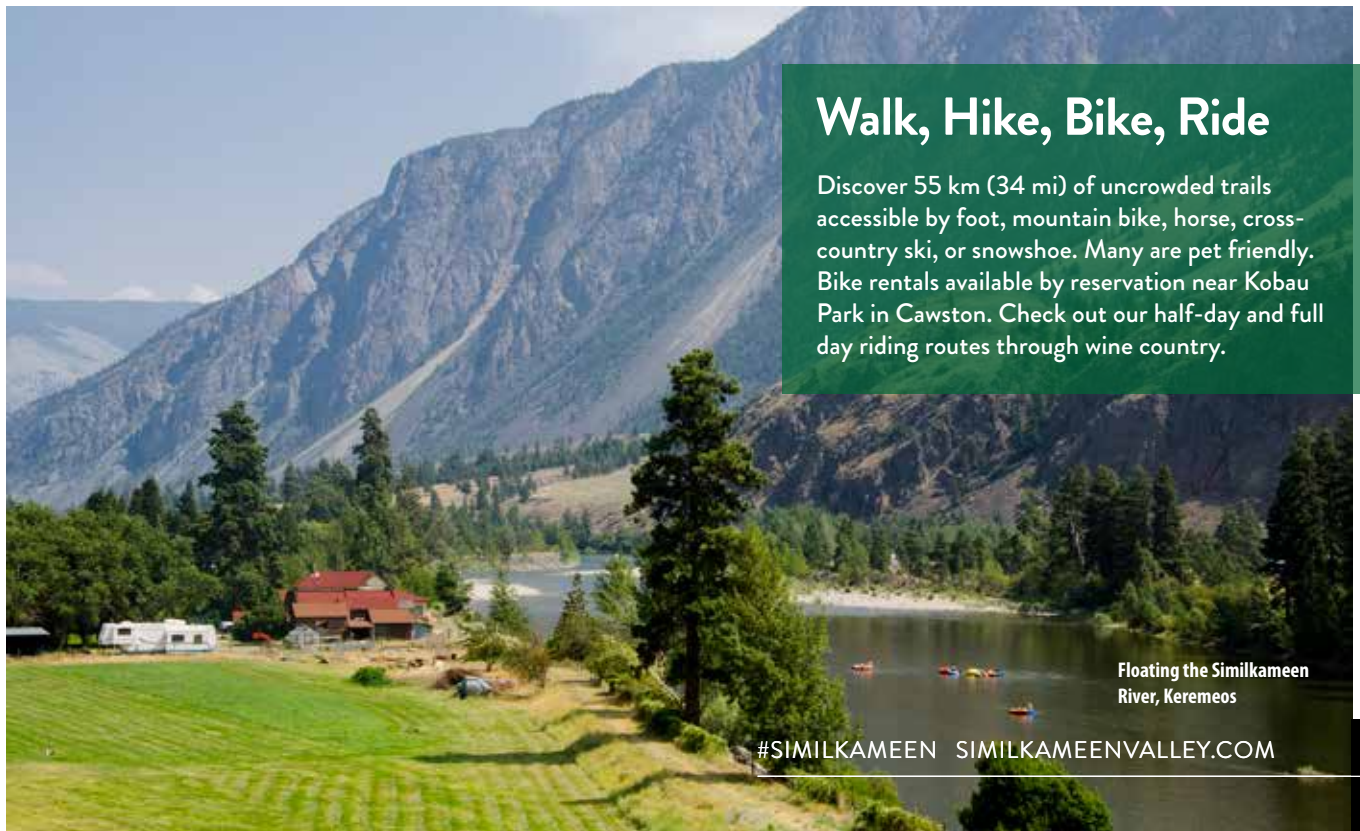

Birdwatching & Wildlife Viewing

One of the real treasures of our valley is its wildlife. You might spot bighorn sheep, mountain goats, mule deer, eagles, elk, moose and bears. Princeton's Swan Lake Nature Reserve offers visitors 15 km (9 mi) of marked trails, two bird blinds, a small lake surrounded by a riparian zone, and an abundance of wildflowers and wildlife. Explore the richness of our diverse ecosystem and view the protected grasslands of the Similkameen.

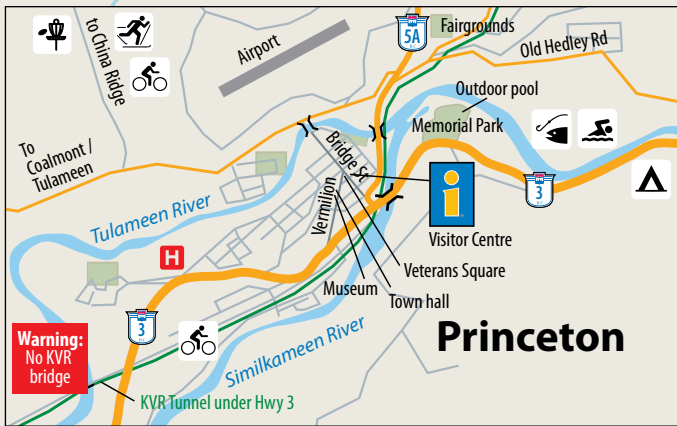

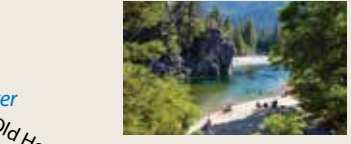

Four Season Fishing

Freshwater fishing is easily accessible along the Crowsnest Highway 3, from Manning Park to Cawston, as well as along Highways 3A and 5A. Explore productive waters known for trout, mountain whitefish, and the elusive west slope cutthroat. With many lakes and rivers to choose from, the Similkameen has been drawing anglers to its waters for generations. Fishing license required.

- E.C. Manning Provincial Park, primarily for rainbow trout in the Lightning Lakes chain (non-motorized)
- The secluded Chain, Osprey, or Link lakes along the Princeton-Summerland backroad – All great spots to drop a line and bask in the glories of the great outdoors while waiting for that first bite.
- Ashnola, Tulameen, or Similkameen Rivers – Feel the thrill of casting for rainbow trout or mountain whitefish in the fast currents and deep-water pools.
- Otter Lake in Tulameen – A local favourite, and the largest lake in the Similkameen, it's where you can dream of landing the "big one."
- McKenzie, McCaffrey, Dry Lakes and Allison Lake, all teeming with rainbow trout. In cattle country the fish are always biting.
- Yellow Lake on 3A – A popular spot year-round, you can fish from a boat, a float, a dock or in winter through an ice hole for kokanee, rainbow and brook trout.

Enjoy Ice fishing on most Princeton lakes from mid-December through to March. Yellow Lake has a slightly shorter season. It's mountain country so be prepared with the right gear, and you'll have a whopper of a story to take home.

SIMILKAMEEN VALLEY PRINCETON TO HEDLEY

GETTING HERE

From west to east, travel through ever-changing landscapes—from the rugged mountains, forests, and rivers of E.C. Manning Park to Princeton and Hedley, then into the sweeping valley of Keremeos and Cawston, where orchards, vineyards, and ranch lands give way to cacti and sagebrush near Osoyoos and Highway 97.

Whether you're seeking adventure or relaxation, you set the pace. The Similkameen River flows through the heart of the valley along Crowsnest Highway 3, connecting our communities with convenient access and charging stations along the way.

Located about four hours from Vancouver International Airport, the valley is easily reached via Highway 1 through Hope, Highway 5 and 5A from Merritt, or Highway 3 and 3A from Alberta and Penticton, as well as from the U.S. via Osoyoos Highway 97 or Nighthawk. Check out our website for road trip travel routes from any direction.



Explore our 140 km (87 mi) stretch of the Crowsnest Scenic Highway 3 when road touring by vehicle, RV or motorcycle, be sure to stop by each unique area in the Similkameen Valley, from West to East here are the highlights.



PLACES TO GO



Princeton

Princeton, the largest community in the valley with a population of approximately 3,325, sits at the confluence of the Similkameen and Tulameen Rivers. Known as the Bronze Statue Capital of Canada, explore more than 25 life-sized statues on a self-guided walking tour, including “The Mountain Man,” which honours the region’s Indigenous and trapping history.

Discover local culture and heritage at the Princeton Museum, along with murals and historic sites of interest throughout town. Visit Bridge Street Plaza, a hub for community gatherings, and enjoy nearby recreation such as disc golf, tennis, and pickleball. Walk or ride along the Bridge of Dreams on the Kettle Valley Rail Trail near Two Rivers Park where you can pan for gold. View BC’s largest Jet Wind Vane at the Princeton Airport and take in annual events such as rodeo, car shows and live music.

Stay at the Princeton Municipal Campground, offering 73 year-round sites with accessible parking and a shower house that highlights local history. Outdoor activities abound, including birdwatching at Swan Lake Nature Reserve, fishing in nearby lakes, and playing a round at the historic 18-hole golf course.



China Ridge

China Ridge recreational area is 8.5 km (5 mi) northwest of Princeton and has an extensive trail system comprises a north-south upland ridge running through forested regions, grassy slopes, and reforested areas. Explore a total of 45 kilometres (28 mi) of well-maintained hiking, biking, horseback riding and cross-country and snowshoe trails winding through the Ridge and 19 ungroomed trails, some are pet friendly. Family friendly disc-golf is available at the entrance to the site.

HISTORICAL HAMLETS

COALMONT – NORTHWEST OF PRINCETON

Coalmont was established in the early 1900s as a mining town and railway junction on the Kettle Valley Railway. Today, it has an estimated population of 100 and is located 18 km (11 mi) northwest of Princeton. Known for outdoor recreation and fishing, visitors can discover White Sands Beach along the Tulameen River and still view the historic Coalmont Hotel, a lasting landmark of the past. Nearby, Granite Creek offers a glimpse into 1885 gold rush history, including a preserved cemetery.

TULAMEEN – NORTHWEST OF PRINCETON

Tulameen, originally known as Otter Flat, has roots in the 1880s gold rush, the Hudson’s Bay Brigade Trail, and the later Kettle Valley Railway. This historic community, with an estimated population of 250, is located on the south end of Otter Lake, about 26 km (16 mi) northwest of Princeton. In summer, enjoy swimming, boating, fishing, and relaxing by the water, while winter offers skating on the covered outdoor ice rink and access to snowmobile trails. Otter Lake Provincial Park (51 hectares) features a forested lakeside campground with 45 non-serviced sites, a beach, and a boat launch for boating, swimming, and fishing. Wildlife sightings are common, with beavers, otters, and a variety of bird species frequently seen.

HEDLEY – SOUTHEAST OF PRINCETON

Visit the eclectic hamlet of Hedley, a historic mining town with a population of about 400 (including the surrounding area). A lasting reminder of the gold rush era, the community features preserved historic buildings and a rustic, scenic atmosphere. Home to the Upper Similkameen Indian Band office, Hedley offers cultural insight at the Hedley Heritage Museum with exhibits on our local gold prospecting and First Nations history and be sure to take time for coffee and pastries at the onsite Tea & Gift Shop. Try your luck panning for gold in the Similkameen River at the mouth of Hedley/20-Mile Creek, explore the local arts scene, or relax at a local café/coffee house/bakery. Unwind at Stemwinder Park, a peaceful, pine-lined riverside setting where you can camp, fish, and take in the tranquil flow of the river. Riverside camping and RV services are also available nearby.

Follow the Similkameen Valley Farm Trail: A Taste of the Land, Fresh from the Source

Spring, Summer and fall in the Similkameen Valley are shaped by what's growing, ripening, and ready at the roadside. Orchards bloom, farm stands and gates open, and along Highway 3, the bypass and quiet backroads, hand-painted signs lead to fruit stands, heritage sites, and community growing spaces. It's a season defined by freshness—and by the people who grow it.

The Similkameen Valley Farm Trail is a self-guided route through Keremeos and Cawston, where agriculture isn't staged for visitors—it's part of everyday life. Along the way, stops range from historic landmarks to working farms and community food hubs, each reflecting a different layer of the valley's agricultural story.

A highlight is the historic Grist Mill and Gardens at Keremeos, where heritage orchards, gardens, and seasonal events bring the valley's farming history to life. In Cawston, the Ntamtqen Community Garden and Food Hub offer a living example of regenerative growing, food education, and community connection, with shared harvests and produce available throughout the growing season. Seasonal celebrations add another layer to the trail. The annual Similkameen Sizzle Pepper Festival heats up the valley each September with local peppers, food tastings, and lively contests, while the Grist Mill's Heritage Fall Fair brings growers, makers, and visitors together to mark the close of the harvest season in true Similkameen style.

More than a collection of stops, the Farm Trail reflects a living food system—rooted in land, community, and seasonality. Take your time, follow your curiosity, and experience the valley one stop, one story, and one harvest at a time, there are over 20 stops to choose from.

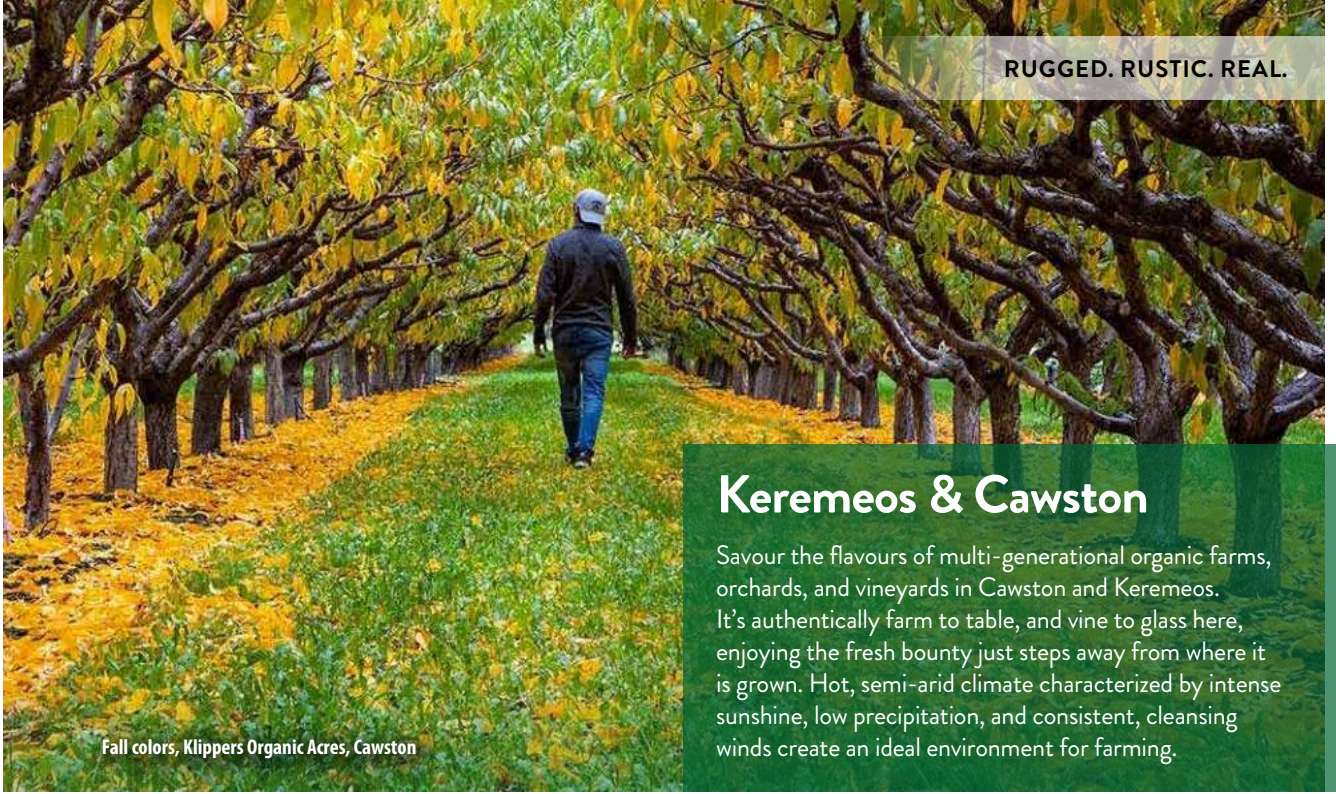

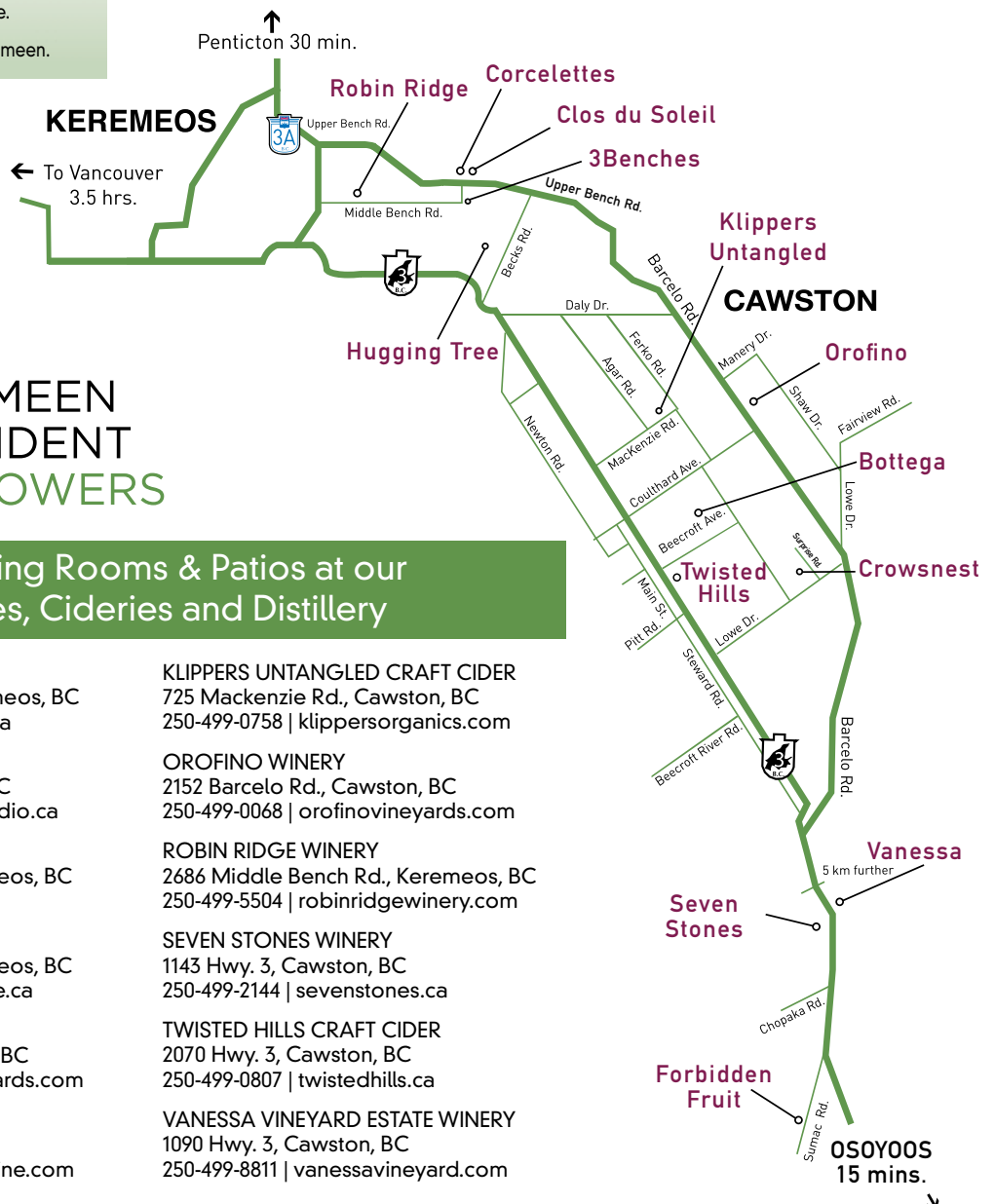

Keremeos

Keremeos has an estimated population of 1,800 and is known as Fruit Stand Capital of Canada with nearly 20 farms stands to explore. Located below a steep peak known locally as K Mountain, along the banks of the Similkameen River, it is surrounded by orchards and vineyards. Sip and savour at the boutique wineries, orchards and restaurants in and around the Village of Keremeos. Visit the historic Grist Mill and Gardens a captivating Provincial Heritage Site, with the distinction of being the last operational waterwheel flour mill in British Columbia, dating back to 1877. Keremeos is a starting point for Ashnola recreation area and Cathedral Provincial Park adventures.
